

I presented on the effects of salinity on greenhouse gas production from marsh soils along a wetland salinity gradient. This is important because salinities are changing in coastal Louisiana due to saltwater intrusion and hydrologic restorations such as river diversions. This conference gave me the opportunity to share my findings with other scientists who are also interested in ecosystem responses to anthropogenic and natural perturbations.
